

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION
FOR THE OFFICE OF
TAX COLLECTOR

Whereas, pursuant to section 11.03 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville, the Jacksonville City Council has called a Special First Consolidated Government Election for filling the vacancy in the office of the Duval County Tax Collector as a result of the resignation of Tax Collector Michael Corrigan effective June 1, 2018.

Whereas, the dates for the Special First and Special General Elections have been fixed by provision of section 11.03 ordinance code, the City Council states as follows:

Register to vote on or before July 30, 2018 for the Special First Election.

Whereas, Section 100.151, Florida Statutes provides for a local government to hold a special election and to align the dates of qualifying and filing reports with those dates already set by statute for the Election cycle, and

Whereas, Section 100.111(2)(c) Florida Statutes provides for candidates seeking to qualify by the petition method must obtain valid signatures as follows:

Duval County Tax Collector: collection and verification of 1,470 valid signatures.

Whereas, petitions for candidates qualifying by the petition process must be submitted to the Duval County Supervisor of Elections no later than **Monday, June 4, 2018 at noon** in order that the Supervisor of Elections can verify the signatures and certify the results no later than **Friday, June 15, 2018**. The qualifying fees based upon the tax collector's qualifying fee in 2015:

| Party affiliated candidates | \$9,116.90 |
| Non-party affiliated candidates | \$6,078.00 |

Therefore, the City of Jacksonville City Council declares that the dates which candidates may qualify for said Special Election shall be from **Noon, June 18 through Noon, June 22, 2018**. The due dates and periods covered for reports are the same as those for candidates for the Primary Election and General Election in 2018.

A final report is due 90 days after the candidate becomes unopposed, is eliminated or elected.
